Micro Fiction: up to 100 words
Flash Fiction: 100-1,000 words
Short story: 1,000 – 7,500 words
Novelette: 7,500 – 20,000 words.
Novella: 20,000 – 50,000 words
Novel: 50,000 – 110,000 words
Epics and Sequels: Over 110,000 words

Page Counts: with approx. 250 words to each page, a 400 page novel is about 100,000 words.
